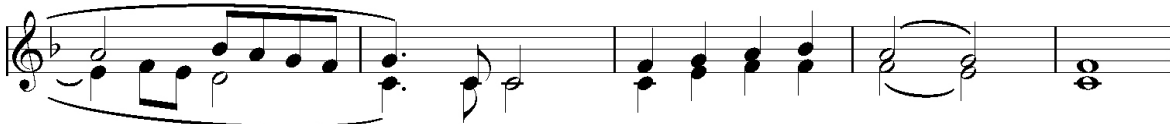

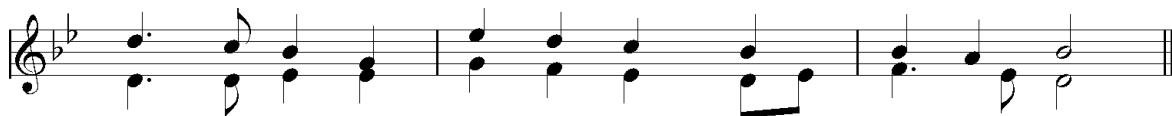

We await his coming in glory;


And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all;

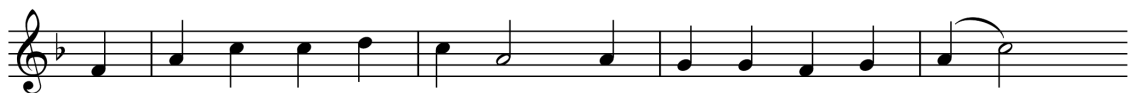

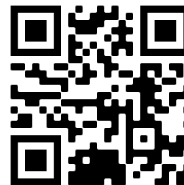
