
Good Friday Fauré Requiem with Passion Gospel & Adoration of the Cross

March 29, 2024–12:00 p.m.

On this day the ministers enter in silence.

All then kneel for silent prayer, after which the Presider stands and says,

PresiderBlessed be our God,PeopleFor ever and ever. Amen.PresiderLet us pray.

Almighty God, we pray you graciously to behold this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen**.

The people sit for the Requiem & Passion Gospel. There is silence following each lesson.

The Passion Gospel of John with Fauré Requiem

Please remain seated and listen to the reading of the Passion. The following is not a full text; only text relevant to the congregation is excerpted below. The customary responses before and after the Gospel are omitted.

Clergy	The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.
Narrator	Peter denied it and said,
Reader	"I am not."
Narrator	One of the slaves of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked,
Reader	"Did I not see you in the garden with Jesus?"
Narrator	Again Peter denied it, and at that moment the cock crowed.

A period of silence is observed.

Offertorium

Sacrifices and prayers to You, O Lord, in praise we offer: receive them for those souls whom today we remember. Allow them, O Lord, to pass from death to life as to Abraham of old You promised, and to his seed.

Narrator	Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. They kept coming up to him, saying,
Reader	"Hail, King of the Jews!"
Narrator	and striking him on the face. Pilate went out again and said to the crowd,

Reader	"Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I find no case against him."
Narrator	So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them,
Reader	"Here is the man!"
Narrator	When the chief priests and the police saw Jesus, they shouted,
People	"Crucify him! Crucify him!"
Narrator	When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus outside and sat on the judge's bench at a place called the Stone Pavement, or in Hebrew Gabbatha. Now it was the day of Preparation for the Passover; and it was about noon. Pilate said to the crowd,
Reader	"Here is your King!"
Narrator	They cried out,
People	"Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!"
Narrator	Pilate asked them,
Reader	"Shall I crucify your King?"
Narrator	The chief priests answered,
Reader	"We have no king but the emperor."
Narrator	Then Pilate handed Jesus over to them to be crucified.

(The Congregation stands.)

(The Congregation kneels in silence, sitting back in their seats when clergy do so.)

Deliver me, O Lord, from everlasting death on that dreadful day when the heavens and earth shall be moved when You shall come to judge the world by fire.

With trembling I am seized and with fear, until the trial to come, and also the coming wrath.

That day, day of wrath, calamity and misery, that day, a day great and exceedingly bitter.

Rest eternal grant them, O Lord, and may light perpetual shine upon them.

Narrator Since it was the day of Preparation, the Jews did not want the bodies left on the cross during the sabbath, especially because that sabbath was a day of great solemnity ...

... Now there was a garden in the place where he was crucified, and in the garden there was a new tomb in which no one had ever been laid. And so, because it was the Jewish day of Preparation, and the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

Veneration of the Cross

A wooden cross is now brought into the church and placed in the sight of the people. The versicle and response is said or sung three times.

ClergyBehold the wood of the cross,
on which hung the Savior of the world.PeopleCome, let us worship.

The congregation may kneel or sit.

After veneration by the Altar Party, members of the congregation may come forward to venerate the cross, forming a single line in the center aisle.

You may make any appropriate reverence: kneel or stand before the cross, touch it with your hand or kiss it.

For the following anthems, please read the parts in bold aloud.

We glory in your cross, O Lord, and praise and glorify your holy resurrection; for by virtue of your cross joy has come to the whole world.

May God be merciful to us and bless us, show us the light of his countenance, and come to us.

Let your ways be known upon earth, your saving health among all nations.

Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you.

We glory in your cross, O Lord, and praise and glorify your holy resurrection; for by virtue of your cross joy has come to the whole world.

Anthem 2

We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, **because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**

If we have died with him, we shall also live with him; If we endure, we shall also reign with him.

We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

Anthem 3

O Savior of the world, who by thy cross and precious blood hast redeemed us, **Save us and help us, we humbly beseech thee, O Lord.**

A period of silence is observed.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The service concludes with the following prayer. No blessing or dismissal is added.

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, we pray you to set your passion, cross, and death between your judgment and our souls, now and in the hour of our death. Give mercy and grace to the living; pardon and rest to the dead; to your holy Church peace and concord; and to us sinners everlasting life and glory; for with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

The Congregation leaves the Church in silence. You are invited to remain in prayer.
